



Classification of Resources:

(a) On the Basis of Origin - Biotic and Abiotic

Biotic Resources are obtained from the biosphere and have life. Eg: Human beings, flora and fauna, fisheries, live stock etc.

Abiotic Resources: All those things which are composed of non-living things are called abiotic resources. Eg: rock s and metals.

(b) On the Basis of Ownership - Individual, Community, National and International Individual Resources are own ed privately by individuals. In villages, people own lands whereas in urban areas people own plots, houses and oth er properties. Eg: Plantation, pasture lands, ponds, water in wells etc. Community Owned Resources are accessibl e to all the members of the community. Eg: Grazing grounds, burial grounds, public parks, picnic spots, playgroun ds etc. National Resources are owned by a nation or country. All the minerals, water resources, forests, wildlife, la nd within the political boundaries and oceanic area up to 12 nautical miles (22.2 km) from the coast termed as terri torial water and resources therein belong to the nation. Eg: Roads, canals, railways etc.

International Resources are regulated by international institutions. The oceanic resources beyond 200 nautical mil es of the Exclusive Economic Zone belong to open ocean and no individual country can utilise these without the c oncurrence of international institutions.

Besides seeking more income, one way or the other, people also seek things like equal treatment, freedom, securit y, and respect of others. They resent discrimination. All of these are important goals. In fact, in some cases, these may be more important than more income or more consumption because material goods are not all that you need t o live. Money, or material things that one can buy with it, is one factor on which our life depends. But the quality of our life also depends on non-material things. Consider an example: If you get a job in a far-off place, before acc epting it you would try to consider many factors, apart from income, such as facilities for your family, working at mosphere, or opportunity to learn. In another case, a job may give you less pay but may offer regular employment that enhances your sense of security. Another job, however, may offer high pay but no job security and also leave no time for your family. This will reduce your sense of security and freedom. Similarly, for development, people l ook at a mix of goals. It is true that if women are engaged in paid work, their dignity in the household and society increases. However, it is also the case that if there is respect for women there would be more sharing of housewor k and a greater acceptance of women working outside. A safe and secure environment may allow more women to t ake up a variety of jobs or run a business. Hence, the developmental goals that people have are not only about bett er income but also about other important things in life.
